“Scoutmaster and Assistance Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training” will be offered on Saturday again this year. This is a chance to train your leaders and committee members without investing another day. They will be there already. Every effort will be made to find a "Trained Leader" to help watch your unit if required.
